Dear Chairman Wyden and Ranking Member Hatch:

The undersigned organizations, which represent farmers, grain elevators, grain processors and millers, feed manufacturers, and others who produce and distribute our nation's food, feed, fuel, and fiber, strongly urge the U.S. Senate to pass S. 2955, "A Bill to Revise the Inland Waterways Trust Fund Financing Rate."

S. 2955, introduced by Senators Casey, Alexander, Harkin, Klobuchar and Franken, would increase the inland waterways user fee by 9 cents per gallon. Commercial vessel operators currently pay 20 cents per gallon, which is deposited in the Inland Waterways Trust Fund and is used to finance lock-and-dam construction and major rehabilitation.

The increase to 29 cents per gallon is supported by both barge carriers and their customers — the agricultural shippers that include our members — to provide the financial wherewithal to make the necessary improvements to our nation's waterways infrastructure. This provision is essential to the rehabilitation and maintenance of the inland waterways system, and thus our future global competitiveness. Therefore, we urge the Senate immediately pass S. 2955.

Thank you for your continued leadership and consideration of this important legislation.
