Dear Congressmen Camp and Levin,

The U.S. Biotech Crops Alliance (USBCA), comprised of the undersigned organizations, appreciates the Ways and Means Committee's role in elevating agricultural biotechnology trade policy priorities to a high-level discussion within the Congress and the Executive Branch agencies, particularly with respect to China. Your leadership has proven invaluable to the entire U.S. agricultural value chain. By asking questions of key administration officials and listing agricultural biotechnology among the committee's top priorities with China, the Ways and Means Committee is acknowledging the significant economic benefit associated with the trade of U.S. grains and co-products derived through biotechnology.

Congressional engagement over the past year was critical to elevating agricultural biotechnology to a discussion item at the recent summit between President Obama and President Xi in Beijing. With this meeting behind us, focus now shifts to the U.S.-China Joint Commission on Commerce and Trade (JCCT) meeting on December 17 and 18 in Chicago, where industry believes it is essential for the United States and China to craft a comprehensive framework agreement establishing a schedule of commitments focused on resolving this issue in the near term.

The USBCA looks forward to conducting an ongoing dialogue with members of the Ways and Means Committee. Continued engagement is essential, not only regarding China, but also the European Union, another important trading partner with which the United States is experiencing significant trade policy challenges associated with agricultural biotechnology.
