Dear Chairmen Moran and Aderholt and Ranking Members Merkley and Farr:

The undersigned organizations represent a broad range of agricultural commodity and farm member organizations along with members of the agricultural private sector that would benefit from lifting the trade embargo with Cuba.

American agribusinesses are continuing to lose market share in Cuba to the EU, Asia and South America. The U.S. currently ranks fourth in exports to Cuba where at one time we consistently and substantially were ranked first. Located just 90 miles from the U.S. coast, Cuba should be a prime and easy trading partner for American businesses.

Cuba currently imports up to 80 percent of its food resources with an annual value of nearly \$2 billion. With increases in tourism from the U.S. to Cuba, demand for food is expected to continue rising and it's important that U.S. commodities are offered the opportunity to fill that demand.

Our organizations support the provision in the President's Proposed FY2017 Budget that would provide funding for U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Foreign Agricultural Service (FAS) and Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) employees to be housed within the U.S. Embassy in Havana, Cuba. Providing USDA boots on the ground in Cuba will help to provide U.S. agribusinesses the opportunity to obtain commodity market supply and demand figures, support the marketing efforts of U.S. exporters, assist in resolving phytosanitary barriers, and safeguard U.S. agriculture from the threat of new pests and diseases. We feel that funding these USDA positions in Cuba in anticipation of an eventual lifting of the embargo will help to make the transition process run more efficiently, assist U.S. agribusinesses to regain the role as Cuba's top exporter, and advance U.S. agricultural interests.

Chairmen Moran and Aderholt and Ranking Members Merkley and Farr, we appreciate your continued leadership in actively representing the agriculture industry's appropriations. Thank you for your consideration for funding the USDA positions in the FY 2017 spending bill.
