

WHY NAFTA MATTERS TO OILSEED PROCESSORS

- NAFTA created significant market opportunities for U.S. exports of soy meal, soy oil, soybeans and increased exports of meat and poultry products that use soy meal as feed.
 - Mexico is our number two export market for both soy meal and soy oil; it is also our number two market for exports of soybeans.
 - Soy Meal exports to Mexico represent 15% of total soy meal exports.
 - Soy Oil exports to Mexico represent 24% of total soy oil exports.
 - In 2017 exports of soy meal to Mexico was \$579 million down from \$800 million in 2016.
 - In 2017 exports of soy oil to Mexico was \$202 million down from \$227 million in 2016.
- Canada ranks as our number four market for U.S. exports of soy meal; it is our number seven market for soy oil.
- In 2017, the U.S. exported \$488 million and \$2.36 billion of soy products to Canada and Mexico, respectively.
- In 2017, the U.S. exported \$1.25 billion and \$2.45 billion of U.S. pork and poultry to Canada and Mexico, respectively.
- Losing our reliable supplier status would seriously undermine the benefits the U.S. soy sector gained over the past 24 years.
- These benefits would flow to our competitors in South America, as Mexico and Canada look to diversify their sources of soy products, as well as meat and poultry product.

Improving U.S. Export Opportunities under NAFTA:

NOPA believes that the Administration and the Members of Congress have an excellent opportunity to modernize NAFTA, and thereby:

- Expand the export opportunities of U.S. soybean and soybean products, as well as meat and meat products within North America.
- Improve the prospects for global regulatory predictability and consistency around non-tariff issues, such as: strengthening TBT requirements, implementing a consistent SPS-plus Agreement and Rapid Response Mechanisms.
- Increase the transparency and cooperation on agriculture biotechnology regulatory policies between the United States, Canada and Mexico.
